This involves


- Information for "bathers"


So what did this year's Environment Agency monitoring show?



Where's the faecal pollution coming from?

- Anglian Water sewage system?
 - Inadequate "normal" treatment?
 - "Spills"?
- Surface water when it rains?
 - Misconnections?
 - Birds, dogs, cattle?
- Private septic tanks?

What should happen to our waste water?



Haslingfield Sewage Works 4km upstream, treats a lot of sewage



What could possibly go wrong?

- "Spills" due to
 - Too much water
 - Blockages
 - Mechanical failures



Overflow tanks at Haslingfield Sewage Works full to the brim




A "spill" at Harston pumping station releasing diluted sewage into the street at Button End

"Spills" happen alarmingly frequently.

- Data on overflows from sewage works is available online, but it's not always reliable.
- Haslingfield and Foxton Sewage Works nominally overflow 10-30% of the time. Plus...
- Our EIRs reveal at least 35 spills in Harston, Haslingfield and Grantchester since Jan 2021 from pumping stations and the network.



Sewage escapes from Anglian Water Network (excluding discharges from Sewage Works)




Anglian Water responses to CVF's Environmental Information Requests

What goes in must come out..

- After treatment, the effluent is continuously released from the sewage works into the river.
- E. coli in effluent from Haslingfield Sewage Works is ~10x worse than from Cambridge Sewage Works




We've analysed the test results

2022-23



E.coli in low river flow 30/8/23-23/9/23








E.coli/100ml in flood conditions 10-29 March 2023

Red line shows Haslingfield Sewage works







Our conclusions...

- Haslingfield Sewage Works is clearly a major source of E.coli
- But something is releasing E.coli upstream of the sewage works too
- In nice summer weather, E.coli levels decline across
 Grantchester meadows, despite the presence of cattle.
- But in flood, it's ~10x worse, and it doesn't improve across Grantchester meadows


- In 2023 we got our own portable testing "lab"
- On the Environment Agency's advice, we've been investigating the ditches and what happens in wet weather..





It seems to be worst in, or just after, wet weather






What about the cattle?

- On Grantchester Meadows the cattle made no difference in 2022/3.
- In Vicar's Brook, the surface water outfalls seem to be a bigger occasional contributor than the cattle.

Change in E.coli /100ml between Grantchester Cricket Pitch field and Newnham riverbank club









- After rain, E. coli in Paradise ditch is as bad as in Haslingfield Sewage Works' effluent
- Is it from misconnections in Newnham Croft?



What happens next?

- Preliminary investigations: Ongoing.
- Official announcement of Bathing Water Status: ~Nov 2024
- Apportionment Study: starts ~April 2025
- Design and implement improvements: completion by 2027

What improvements do we expect/want from Anglian Water?

- Ultra Violet (UV) treatment at Haslingfield Sewage Works (in budget)
- Bigger storm tanks at Haslingfield Sewage Works (in budget)
- Upgraded sewage pumping stations and rising main (we hope)

What improvements do we want elsewhere?

- Fewer misconnections
- Well maintained/upgraded septic tanks
- More rain gardens and wetlands

To help:

- Check that builders haven't misconnected your drains.
- Call the Environment Agency, immediately on 0800 80 7060 if you see suspected pollution incidents
- Never, ever, put wet wipes down the toilet
- And join us on the 'March for Clean Water' on 3 Nov
